

Installation Notes:


- · Be sure to shut off water supply before beginning
- Use pipe thread sealant such as PST on all threaded joints.
- · Check the packaging for missing items BEFORE beginning installation. If items are missing, contact your supplier.

Tools Required for Installation


- 1/8" Allen Wrench
- #3 Allen Wrench
- · Channel Lock Pliers
- Spanner Wrench Part #22780
- · Vandal Resistant Models: Bit 21334 (Supplied)

Installation of Valve Body Assembly to Existing Sink

- 1. Place gasket (C) on top of valve body (D).
- Keeping gasket in place, butt the valve body against the bottom of the sink and hand tighten the clamping ring
 (B) into the valve body from inside of the sink. Note: Following normal plumbing practices, a small bead of silicone is recommended between the clamping ring and sink compartment.
- 3. Using a spanner wrench, completely tighten the clamping ring. Note: the hole in the rotor arm must be pointing towards the front of the sink as shown in Figure 1.
- 4. Insert handle (F) into hole and attach with screw (E)


Installation of Vandal Resistant Strainers

- Slide vandal resistant bar (C) into slots in bottom of clamping ring (D) and rotate one quarter turn.
- 2. Snap flat strainer (B) into clamping ring.
- Insert screw into center hole of flat strainer (B) until it reaches the hole in the middle of the vandal resistant bar (C) and tighten using a 1/8" Allen Wrench.

Troubleshooting Tips

- Teflon Seals- Remove strainer. Unscrew the retaining nut, which contains one of the seals with a 1"
 Allen wrench. Pull the ball valve out from the top. The lower seal is now visible and can be removed.
 When replacing these seals make sure they are snapped firmly into place before reassembling your valve. See Figures 4 and 5.
- O-ring- In order to check this part for wear, it is necessary to (1) remove the handle, rotor nut and rotor.
 The O-ring is the small black rubber ring located on the rotor arm itself. Important: If while pulling the rotor arm out, the rotor stop is accidentally removed, it must be put back with the tabs in their original position in order to stop the handle in the proper position. See Figure 3




