
Observe all local building codes.

GETTING STARTED


- Ensure that you have gathered all the required materials that are needed for the installation.
- All fasteners must be mounted securely into solid wood studs, or wood blocking within the wall, for proper support.
- If drilling custom mounting holes into a non-drilled track, be sure to use a 3/8" diameter titanium coated or cobalt steel drill bit. Drill slowly and carefully. Holes should be evenly spaced, and ensure that there is one mounting hole within 4" of each end.
- If your baseboard interferes with your barn door, additional spacers or longer standoffs may be necessary. Contact Customer Relations for further assistance.







Parts Diagram










Drywall Installation





6. Install the door guide. For a door that has been notched on the bottom, use the concealed guide. For a door with standard thickness, use the U-shaped guide. For thicker doors, use the adjustable guide.
